## Bathroom & Kitchen Care & Maintenance

### Instructions

- Do not use an abrasive or solvent cleaner as they will damage the surface.
- Sugar water can be used to remove grease.
- To remove dust and dirt, use a clean, soft, lint-free cotton cloth, warm water and wipe down all interior and exterior surfaces.
- Immediately after washing, dry all surfaces with another clean, lint-free cotton cloth.
- Avoid using a dish rag or sponge that previously was used with harsh detergents.
- Wipe up spills, splatters and water spots as they occur, keeping cabinets and countertop surfaces dry.
- Do not use aerosol sprays containing silicones or paste waxes.
- Avoid ammonia based cleaners and soaps with dye.
- Give special attention to areas near the sink and dishwasher that come in contact with moisture. Make sure that water and detergents do not dry on the cabinet surface.

### Glass and Mirror Inserts

- Use a household glass cleaner with a soft, clean cloth.
- Apply the glass cleaner directly to a cloth rather than the glass or mirror to avoid excess liquid running into cabinet joints.

### Basins & Baths

To clean your basin and/or bath, use a soft cloth, sponge or soapy nylon brush. Be sure to rinse the sink well after cleaning and dry. Cleaning on a regular basis will help prevent the development of hard water deposits. If you develop persistent stains, try a non-abrasive cleaner such as dishwasher soap. DO NOT use any acidic bath and tile cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners, ammonia, abrasive or soft paste cleaners, vinegar, alcohol, window cleaners or lemon juice. In addition DO NOT use abrasive cleaning pads such as steel wool, metal brushes or scouring powders.

## Shower cleaning tips

- Always remove any water remaining on the glass, frame & fittings.
- Do not allow limescale to build up on the enclosure
- Polish the glass and framework once a week
- Do not leave neat cleaning products on the surfaces
- Do not use and spray on and leave cleaning products on the glass
- All cleaners should be non-abrasive and between PH 4 & 8
- To remove limescale a solution of 50:50 white vinegar & water can be used, ensure it is rinsed thoroughly & polished off with a dry cloth
- Easy access waste trap should be removed and cleaned weekly.
